Title : Ukraine as a Place of Economic Imagination (1870-2022)

Abstract: Like no other country in Europe, Ukraine served as a projection surface for economic ideas in the modern era. These ideas came on the one hand from different strata of the Ukrainian population, but on the other hand from non-autochthonous actors. In some cases, Ukraine was seen as a component of a larger (imperial) economic space, and in other cases, as an independent economic entity that was not primarily dependent on integration into other economic spaces in order to unfold its full imagined potential. All these ideas had in common that they attested to Ukraine's – in theory – great potential, provided that the space was only reshaped in the right way. The project focuses on the period between the beginning of industrialization in Ukraine and the contemporary period. The following questions take center stage: Why was Ukraine repeatedly the focal point of large-scale economic planning? Why could these imaginaries be reproduced over a long period of time? Who were the subjects behind the idea of Ukraine as a potent economic space at what time? The methodological inspiration for comes from the use of discourse analysis in historical studies. The focus is on the production and circulation of economic knowledge about Ukraine and its utilization. The project is located at the interface of economic and cultural history and combines social sciences and humanities approaches.

Buddhism's profound influence on Mongolia's history, culture, and worldview has shaped Mongolian Buddhism, characterized by unique monasteries, monks, rules, and rituals. Research on Mongolian Buddhism, spanning Religious, Buddhist, and Mongol Studies, thrives as scholars delve into its historical development and contemporary practices. Notably, numerous Mongolists presented their research findings on Mongolian Buddhism during the first "Religious Studies" session at the Eleventh International Congress for Mongolists in 2016. This event signified the increasing scholarly interest in Mongolian Buddhism, offering a forum to explore its diverse facets and facilitate collaboration among researchers. It signaled the robust development of studies on Mongolian Buddhism across various areas of inquiry.

Continued exploration of Mongolian Buddhism is essential for gaining deeper insights into its significance within Mongolia's cultural and religious landscape, as well as its broader impact on the Buddhist world. By examining Mongolian Buddhism's complexities, scholars contribute to a richer understanding of both Mongolia's religious traditions and the global Buddhist community. Therefore, we have decided to host an International Conference on the 'Study of Mongolian Buddhism' in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, on August 26-28, 2024.

Purpose:

The primary objective of convening international scholars who specialize in the study of Mongolian Buddhism is to facilitate the dissemination and discussion of the latest research findings. This conference serves as a platform for expanding cooperation among researchers, fostering scholarly exchange, and critically assessing the contemporary landscape of Mongolian Buddhism. Through structured discourse, participants aim to elucidate the current status of Mongolian Buddhist studies while identifying prevalent challenges encountered within the field. This academic endeavor seeks to deepen our understanding of Mongolian Buddhism's historical trajectory, and cultural manifestations, thereby contributing to the advancement of knowledge in religious studies and related disciplines.

The full-length research paper should have a minimum word count of 3500 words, including the bibliography, and should be submitted in Word document format. The paper should adhere to academic standards and include clear citations and references. The deadline for submitting the research paper is **August 1, 2024**.


