## PROGRAM OF CELEBRATION DEDICATED TO THE 100<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF NYAM-OSORYN TSULTEM (1924-2001)

## NYAM-OSORYN TSULTEM: A CENTENARY OF DEDICATION TO MONGOLIAN ART

#### Purpose:

Nyam-Osoryn Tsultem (1924-2001), Mongolia's Labor Hero, People's Artist, State Prize recipient, and Honored Art Worker of Mongolia, was not only a prolific artist who produced many treasures of twentieth-century Mongolian art. He was also Mongolia's first art historian who received his doctoral degree in art history in 1971. His activities that spanned over sixty years of his life were dedicated to the development of fine art institutions in Mongolia, founding a Museum of Fine Art, establishing the Fine Art School as an independent college, and leading the Union of Mongolian Artists into a prosperous institution. This year marks the centenary of this artist's birth and seven Mongolian art and education institutions are collaborating to celebrate Tsultem's contribution to Mongolian art and art history through three exhibitions, a conference, a dedicated documentary, a dedicated National TV Broadcasting program, and the publication of the artist's unpublished manuscript.

### Celebration Program and Description of the Events:

- Exhibition, titled "Mongol Zurag: the Art of Resistance" at Garibaldi Gallery, Venice, Italy (in conjunction with the 60<sup>th</sup> Venice Biennale), April 20-November 29, 2024. This exhibition showcases Tsultem's heretofore unseen nine Mongol Zurag works in a group exhibition with three contemporary artists. The exhibition will be a part of the conference of Mongolian Studies, organized at the University of Venice Ca' Foscari, on November 27-28, 2024.
- Exhibition, titled "Nyam-Osoryn Tsultem's Art-100 Years", National Gallery of Mongolia, August 26-September 8, 2024. This exhibition will show Tsultem's works from the museum's permanent collection.
- Exhibition at the Zanabazar Museum of Fine Arts, which will showcase Tsultem's
  artworks from private collections, including heretofore unseen works. The show will
  also feature, for the first time, archival records pertaining to the museum's foundation
  in 1965. September 6-20, 2024.

- International conference "Art and Art History in/of Mongolia: Past and Present" at National University of Mongolia, September 6, 2024.
- "Bright Evening" National TV Broadcasting Program about Tsultem and his contribution to art and art history of Mongolia. October, 2024 (exact date TBD).
- Documentary by Batnasan Odkhuu, titled "Maestro", which will feature interviews with Mongolian artists, Tsultem's former collaborators in Japan, France, and the United States. Public showing date TBD.
- New scholarship program named after Nyam-Osoryn Tsultem for study and research of art in Mongolia will be announced at the National University of Mongolia
- Tsultem's manuscript, titled Modern Art of Mongolia, which the artist prepared but was
  not able to print in 1990, will be finally published. This volume is meant to be the last
  album in the set of five albums Tsultem published in 1982-1988 in collaboration with
  photographers Chuluunbaatar, Teruzo Sugiyama, several translators, including historian
  D. Bayarsaikhan to be printed in Tokyo, Japan.

# 12-12 novembre 2024: Colloque "Human-Environment Relations in Central Asia »

The Leibniz-Zentrum Moderner Orient (ZMO) and the Central Asian Studies Network in Germany (CASNiG) cordially invite you to submit an abstract for the 5th annual CASNiG conference on "Human-Environment Relations in Central Asia: Flows, Frictions and Frontiers". The conference will take place at the ZMO in Berlin on 12-13 November 2024.

The conference will focus on the relations that populations across Central Asia develop with their environs and the variegated transformations these relations have undergone in recent years as a result of multiscalar and overlapping social, economic, political, natural, and cultural processes.

In order to reflect and grasp the interconnectedness of various factors shaping our lived experiences and the world around us, we invite contributions to address one or more of the following sets of registers (but without being necessarily limited to them). We believe that these registers will facilitate our discussions about human-environment relations across Central Asia by prompting us to think creatively about what constitutes environment and approach environmental relations, conceptualisations, methodologies, and pedagogies from a comparative perspective:

- Flows (migration, mobilities, translocalities, funds, resources, information, knowledge, discourses, narratives)
  - Frictions (democratic participation and deliberation, resistance, collective action, activism, repression)
  - Frontiers (large-scale infrastructures, extractivism, other forms of re/built environment, governance)

**Abstracts** should be no longer than 300 words and contain the title of the paper, the name and affiliation of the author(s), and up to five keywords. In addition to individual papers, we are also open to alternative forms of knowledge dissemination, such as mini-workshops, roundtables, or artistic interventions. Please submit your abstracts together with a short bio (max. 100 words) by 15 July 2024 to Nader Zaza (nader.zaza(at)zmo.de).
